

Where does the Church get its teachings?

Protestant: The Bible, as interpreted

- Who or what is the interpreter?
- Human Reason! Difficult passages therefore must be reasonable
- No immediate revelation

Where does the Church get its teachings?

Lutheran: Sola Scriptura, the Bible alone

- The literal sense of the passage is taken first, unless there is good evidence to do otherwise
- The Bible does not contradict itself
- The Rule of Faith:
 - Doctrine of Justification
 - Body of the Church's teaching

The Concept of Inspiration

- 3. Why do we call the Bible the Holy Scripture?
- The Bible is the Holy Scripture because God the Holy Spirit gave to His chosen writers the thoughts that they expressed and the words that they wrote (verbal inspiration). Therefore, the Bible is God's own Word and truth, without error (inerrancy). (From Luther's Small Catechism)

The Concept of Inspiration

- Verbal Inspiration: The Holy Spirit carefully guided the process of writing down exactly everything God wanted said, but did it in such a way as to involve the intellect, education, vocabulary and grammar of the original author
 - Dr. Luke's Gospel is very complex Greek
 - St. John's Epistles (letters) are very simple

- The testimony of the New Testament
 - ► 2 Peter 1:20-21 (NIV)
 - Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

- The testimony of the New Testament
 - ► 2 Timothy 3:15-17 (NIV)
 - ...and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

Anyone who breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practices and teaches these commands will be called great in the kingdom of heaven."

- ▶ John 14:25-26 (NIV) "All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you."
- ▶ John 17:20 "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message."
- The standard of the early Church in selecting the canon
 - Only those books written by Apostles, or under their authority, were accepted as inspired
